Program Description

The General English Program (Beginner to Advanced) has been designed for international students from non-English speaking backgrounds seeking to improve their general English language skills. This program consists of six English language proficiency levels. The course focuses on developing students' speaking, listening, reading and writing skills for personal, social, work and study needs.

Assessment Methods

Assessment is continuous, focusing on all four English language skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening. Learners undertake progress tests on fortnightly basis including the Exit Tests for each level to determine their placement at their next level of proficiency.

Delivery mode and Methods:

The mode of delivery is face to face (20 hours/week) on campus. A range of delivery methods are used including use of course textbooks, lectures, written activities, classroom discussions, role plays, pair and group work, research activities, reading and listening tasks, class excursions, use of, electronic resources such as Internet, videos etc.

- All students must be aged 18 years or above.
